## Professional Development Learning Opportunities

The Princeton City School District has created a system of effective learning that supports all educators (teachers and support staff) and encourages professional learning. James Comer, 2017 states, "The whole village concept for improving schools stresses the importance of all school employees working together to help students succeed – everyone from principals, custodians and bus drivers to teachers, paraprofessionals, nurses, administrators, security and food service workers". It is for this reason that the district has a professional development committee that comprises a comprehensive group of individuals that represents both teachers and support staff. The Committee has developed a Professional Development Calendar that comprises professional learning opportunities that align with the district's goals which are outlined in the district's strategic plan and its academic achievement plan. The goals address the whole child and are derived from current achievement data including student performance data on state tests, and evidence related to a broader definition of achievement that may impact student performance: e.g., student engagement; high expectations; instructional strategies; formative assessments; positive behavior and intervention supports (PBIS); social-emotional development; and mental health/ trauma-informed schools.
